It would be EXCEPTIONALLY helpful for everyone who knows of anyone in a school - staff or student- who was infected to look at this report.


If there are cases that were not reported, comment about this here or send me a private message. I have a new connection to the OHA staff who are investigating the reports.

 I know of at least three district employees who had COVID who and they have not been listed on the OHA weekly outbreak report. No one at the district I've asked or local health department has been able to explain to me why not. One response I got from the health department said that they only report confirmed cases so maybe they weren't confirmed. But I know for a fact one was and they quarantined the class. My next email is to OHA. Do you have a recommendation of who to email?

 **Nancy Willard** Klamath county. There were two listed from Klamath City district listed two weeks ago, but not county.


 At my school more than four people had it. Two told everyone, two remained anonymous and at least three others did not test. This did not include family members who also tested positive.

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 Neither of the cases from Neah-Kah-Nie School District #56 are on here. They were reported to staff and community on 12/7 and 12/9. Here is one of the letters from the superintendent.

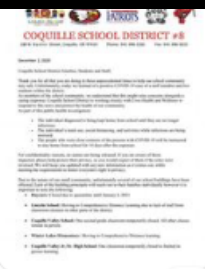

Is the school infections list only for schools doing full time instruction? We had a student who came for LIPI only test positive and I don't see it on there. O'Hara Catholic School, Lane County.

I missed your post with the stats from OHA school cases until tonight. Here is what I found for discrepancies in Coos Bay and North Bend, based on what the districts posted on their respective Facebook pages.

Coos Bay:

12/14/20: Eastside Elementary.

"A person at Eastside" and a Sodexo

employee were known exposures.

11/16/20: District office posted "a person at Madison Elementary, a person at the district office, and a bus driver." The OHA report lists 3 students and 1 staff at Madison on 11/13 as the most recent onset. Three days passed before the district announced it.

11/10/20: "A person in Madison." Not listed on OHA document.

10/26/20: "A person in Madison." Not listed on OHA document.

10/15/20: CBSD posted about a person at Madison (not on OHA document) and a person at Sunset (OHA document lists one student at Sunset with most recent onset on 10/11. Four days passed before CBSD announced it.)

North Bend School District:

11/16/20: NBSD announced presumptive case at Hillcrest Elementary. OHA report lists 2 students and 1 staff member with most recent onset as 11/13.

11/5/20: Announced a positive and a

10/22/20: District reports 3rd staff member positive at NBHS.

10/20/20: District reports 2nd staff member positive at NBHS.

10/19/20: District

\*The OHA document lists 3 staff positive at NBHS with most recent onset as 10/18. I am assuming the 10/19, 10/20, and 10/22 positives were lumped together. If the most recent onset was 10/18, and the last positive was announced by the district on 10/22

I am not sure if it has  
been typical for three  
days or more to pass  
between the date of  
most recent onset  
and the  
announcements by  
districts to the public,  
but this makes  
transparency look like  
a real issue- not to  
mention the cases not  
on the OHA  
document.

I did not see anything  
about Coquille  
schools on the OHA  
report. They closed  
for winter break early  
because of an  
outbreak.

Reedsport school  
district is also  
planning on returning  
to in-person learning  
on 1/4. We were  
closed for two weeks  
because one staff  
member was positive.  
I am angry and  
terrified !The

We had one staff member test positive at Pacific Ridge Elementary School in Clatsop County. We have been virtual but it was an employee who worked in the office. Notice was sent to all staff. I didn't see it on the chart.

I need to stay anonymous, please. Regarding that ODE report you just asked us to look at, the reason Jefferson County 509j couldn't do LIPI last week like they wanted was that too many bus drivers were either tested positive, or exposed/quarantined, so they couldn't get all the kids to buildings like they wanted (I think they

... were not interpreting "limited" correctly as they wanted to get ALL our 9th graders back for a couple hours each week). We have not done anything in person yet, but many of our students and their families have gotten Covid. We teach kids from the Warm Springs reservation, where it's been devastating, killing several tribal elders

and sickening many families. I don't know how many. Yet, our school board is pushing Kate Brown to reopen. They've NEVER asked us teachers a damn thing. We get almost weekly reminder emails from the principal to wear masks... I'm working from home, but many colleagues weren't able to ask for that, and clearly some
